
Correction

The 2014 Castle Tour By Denny Irvine

Saturday morning, February 22 was the date for the Allred Castle Tour. The group started gathering in Sealy at 8:00 at the WalMart parking lot. Clint & Kathy hit the jackpot on the weather, as the forecast was for 70's and no rain.

As we waited for everyone to arrive, there was coffee to enjoy and visiting to be done. At the beginning, there were 12 cars in the lot. We were waiting for the Cordes family, but a failed cylinder shut them down. They would catch up to us later, along with a couple other cars.

We even had one car, the King's, join us after driving in from San Antonio. They were visiting relatives in the area and this made a nice addition to their trip. Left you see Jerry's wife in period dress, drawing on a jug. The sign says Jerry's Juices, but you can see it used to say "Wine" under the paint. (and "end prohibition")

Finally, it was time to pull out with Clint and Kathy in the lead. This was to be a 71 mile tour (not counting getting lost). Cost was \$15 per person, and would include lunch at the castle.

Judging from the turnout, people were ready for a tour after a cold winter. As usual, it wouldn't be a T-Tour without a few breakdowns. Shortly after the turn to New Ulm, Broderick's left rear tire blew out with a loud bang. He had his cousin with him, and I'm sure she was wondering whether this had been a good decision or not. We had him back on the road in less than 20 minutes. We had a vulture trailer on the tour and did have one other car go "on the wagon".

Weather was perfect! The usual spring winds were even missing. And the dogwood trees and redbud bushes were just coming out.

Finally, the cars reached the Castle. To our surprise, the road was blocked by a huge bus with a surprise tour out of south Houston. A motorcycle club was also there and just finishing.

Lunch was your choice of ham or turkey sandwiches, chips, tea and cookies fresh from the bakery. Donuts too! And the bread was thick, homemade and delicious. You had to sit where you could, in the giant kitchen, dining hall, or (like we did) in front of an enormous fireplace.

The four-story tower has bedrooms on each floor, complete with their own bathroom. (Flushing toilets might not be accurate for the period.) Mike Newman plans to offer the castle as a Bed&Breakfast, and is already using the facility for weddings, dinner theater, and family events.

Any self-respecting castle will have a dungeon, and this one didn't disappoint us. There were locks, cages, beds of nails, ball & chain and instruments of torture. In fact, on the second floor, there was a skeleton in a chair who had apparently died from watching continuous recordings of "Wheel Of Fortune"

A view from the 4 story tower shows the moat that is all around the castle. It even has fish—you can see people on the shore trying to catch a few. When we were through looking around, most of the group travelled back to Bellville to check out Newman's Bakery.

Thanks go to Mike Newman for hosting the Space City T's on such an interesting tour. Also, many thanks to Clint and Kathy for taking the time to plan, organize and lead a tour. Their luck with the weather indicates that this might be a good time to buy some lottery tickets.

The '24 has lots of extras such as a floating rear wheel bearing, high speed Ruckstell, Rocky Mountain brakes with Kevlar linings, ball-bearing 4th main, Kevlar transmission bands and clutch disk. The '15 has small version Rocky Mountain style brakes, starter and one piece exhaust/intake manifold.

The engines in both cars were built with special updates. High compression heads, aluminum pistons, stainless steel valves, hardened exhaust valve seats inserts, adjustable valve lifters, tour cam, modern spark plugs, alternator, modern carb and air filter. Both cars are 12 volt and have signal lights.
